From day one, your dad has loved going to the center, where he can engage in activities that stimulate his brain while you can relax knowing that he's in good hands. To have found a facility that not only has a thorough understanding of the phases of your dad's illness but also a supportive staff that understands your struggles has been an indescribable gift. You feel validated for the first time in a long time, and you have a new sense of hope knowing that you have a village of support to love and care for your dad the way he deserves to be cared for ... even when you can't be there.

### **Ushering In A New Chapter**

Catherine met her to-be husband when they were both very young. They went on their first date 41 years ago and have been married for 36 years. Their next chapter together was deciding to combine their strengths to provide medical care

for cognitive diseases. A friend of Catherine's told her about the need for memory care in the Sarasota area, and they made the decision to relocate from Connecticut.

"When we first moved to Florida, we started our medical practice and psychiatric practice," Catherine says. "I am a psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner, and John was a business owner. So, we started our practice to treat and help patients in assisted living and memory care."

With their expertise in the field, they began to notice a great need in these communities for additional support. "The biggest challenge we have seen is between husbands and wives. The spouses either have to move their loved ones into assisted care or continue to care for them at home. It is very difficult for these caregivers to be there for 24-7 care, but also just as difficult to be away from them full-time."

Members and their caregivers get the best of both worlds with Town Square is a brand-new franchise, and we are

the seventh location nationally. The idea for Town Square is to provide cognitive stimulation for members with a mental or physical impairment and give respite to the caregiver. The stress of caregiving is so strong. This isn't just old age. Dementia is a disease, and it comes with a host of other changes that go along with it that make it 10 times harder to care for someone who is just a little forgetful. Town Square offers a place to bring their family member where

they can get cognitive and physical stimulation. The member comes to the facility and is engaged, while the caregiver knows that their family member is cared for."

But John and Catherine have worked to provide more than just a place for the patients. They also offer resources and support groups for the caregivers and other family members. "The support groups have been phenomenal. We used to do them once a month, but they



have become so popular we now do it twice a month. It's really a time when people can come together and share their experiences."

In addition to running the facility,

John and Catherine founded a non-profit to help individuals with dementia and their families with financial support. "Our non-profit is called All 4 The Members because it really is for all the community members. Our mission statement is to help people in the community who are struggling due to cognitive impairment, whether they need a walker, transportation, or adult daycare. One of the things we do to help fund the non-profit is that we charge additional fees at Town Square for haircuts and showers, but that money doesn't go to us. It goes to the non-profit to help other people. Not everyone has the funds or resources to help care for their loved ones facing this illness, and we want to try to give back to help those who need it."

In a community with a large population of elderly, having

access to resources for memory care is of the utmost importance. With Town Square Adult Day Center, John and Catherine are doing all they can to provide that. "This is a terrible, terrible disease with one trajectory, and we really want to help make things easier and make families not feel alone.'

### Truly A Blessing

Lance Wilson is the full-time caregiver for his mother and needed some help for those days he is at work.

"It made sense to try to find somewhere for her to go when I'm not home, but we didn't really find anything that met her needs. But with Town Square, I just got a good feeling about her being there. I am a very faith-driven person, and I had prayed to God about it, so it was just a really good feeling. They were still building out the space when I started talking to them, and they invited me to see the place. It seemed great, so we decided to try it out and see her

reaction. Since she has been there, it has been phenomenal. The staff is so caring, professional, and warm, and they treat everyone as if they are the only ones there.

"She usually goes on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays, and I think it's good for her. She gets a lot of socialization instead of being home alone, and she is usually in good spirits when I pick her up. They also have additional resources on site like doctors and extensive activities that truly are a Godsend."

#### **Improved Life**

Katelyn Smith needed help with her dad, someone who could really understand his situation and needs.

"A lot of people in the general public don't know how to react to someone with a brain illness like Dad's, and sometimes it can be awkward. But at Town Square. they know how to interact, and everything is always a positive experience there.

"Town Square functions as a

small town. They offer a lot of resources not only for the clients but for the clients' families. When a loved one gets a diagnosis of dementia, you have to go out on your own to find resources because most people are uninformed about the phases of the disease.

"Town Square has nursing, primary care, and a psychiatrist They will cut his hair and even bathe him if he needs that done. and that's a huge help. So many places just put them in front of a TV, but they have so many activities here. He is really happy when he goes there. He is enriched. They are so great, and they have improved our quality of life."
